

President's Message

March was a busy month for me, personally and with AAUW!

The March program at the Elmhurst Historical Museum was a private tour of the exhibit on artist and architect **Marion Mahony Griffin**. Attendance was great and as this was "invite a friend" month, we also had several guests. This was an excellent exhibit about one of the first woman architects, the second woman to graduate from MIT and the first to become successful. She worked for Frank Lloyd Wright and there is evidence that some of her ideas were influential to his famous prairie style. I have always had a love of architecture, so this was a personally impactful exhibit.

Coincidentally, as a volunteer at the AAUW Tech Savvy event at Triton College on March 25th, I was assigned to assist the presenters at the Architecture and Design Workshop. I was excited about it and enjoyed the presentations by the female architects to the middle school girls. When I was middle school age, I also wanted to be an architect, and I was drawing room layouts for fun in my spare time. Somewhere in high school, I was told that girls didn't have the spatial skills necessary to be an architect and I shifted my focus. Fortunately, with encouragement from my father, I was still able to break barriers with my math and science skills to eventually become an engineer. At this workshop, I realized for the first time, that I had fallen for that gender stereotyping back in my teens and had given up one of my key interests. Wow! So it was doubly important to me to see these girls learn key concepts of architecture, enjoy making models and come out of the workshop believing they could do this!!!

Suzanne Stock, Maria Patt and Perry Doubt were also volunteers at Tech Savvy. We hope that with what we learned at this event, we can start a few local STEM events. We have some ideas but are looking for more. If you have STEM background, in Science, Technology, Engineering, or Math (or Computers), and are interested in helping with workshops, let Suzanne Stock or I know. We're really hoping this will increase our linkage to the community, and it of course supports our mission to improve gender equality.














Equal Pay Day Chicago is Tuesday - April 4
