I'm a big advocate for dropping the degree requirement so that women like Lily Ledbetter and some of my feminist friends, who don't have degrees, could join. So, I voted Yes on the third amendment. Going forward, I plan to stay active but am also looking at other roles and new phases in my life, especially in my new home town Aurora. The resolution will next go before the House. There will be another ERA Lobby Day in Springfield on May 8th. At this point, we do not know whether the resolution will be brought to the floor on the 8th, but it is expected to be called soon.
