ERA, ERA, Rat-i-fy the ERA

Yes. We Did!

As most of you know by now, both Houses of the Illinois General Assembly provided the required three-fifths YEA votes and adopted SJRCA4, making Illinois the 37th state to approve the ratification of the proposed equal rights amendment to the United States Constitution. It was pretty close on the House vote, squeaking by with only one vote to spare. I hope you had the opportunity to watch the live stream of the House debate and subsequent vote on May 30 – it was exhilarating!

Following the Illinois vote, there was a lot of celebration, and many thanks are due the state representatives and senators who worked so hard to get this passed after a 40-year drought. We also all owe tons of appreciation to the persistent state and local members of AAUW, LWV, P4C, NOW, ERA-IL, ACLU, and so many more organizations and supporters that would not give up on the ERA.

But, as National NOW President Toni Van Pelt told NPR, "There's still more to be done to correct this shameful failure of our Constitution." She is oh so right. Women – we still need for one more state to adopt the traditional legislation so the "three-fourths of the states" threshold is reached, as well as for the U.S. congress to remove the expiration date from the 1980s. So, how can we help get the amendment attached to the constitution?

At this point, we can work with our sisters in North Carolina and Virginia. Currently, my understanding is that the focus is on these two states. Virginia gave it a try at the beginning of the year, but despite a big Blue Wave of women entering their general assembly, ERA supporters were shot down in the legislature, such that the bill was not allowed to come up for a proper vote. Virginia, however, has not given up. As to North Carolina, they are putting their case together. Let's contact them and ask if we can participate in letter-writing and post-carding campaigns, or whatever else they need.
