HR1 For the People Act of 2019

Chris Carson of the League of Women Voters contends that HR1 For the People Act of 2019 addresses the new level of concern for election cybersecurity and transparency of political ads raised by the Special Counsel's report.

The For the People Act reads: "To expand Americans' access to the ballot box, reduce the influence of big money in politics, and strengthen ethics rules for public servants, and for other purposes."

This bill would specifically help women by empowering small dollar financing of campaigns - the funding choice for many if not most of the successful 2018 campaigns of women. Secondly, the bill would require gender to be considered for membership of independent redistricting commissions.

Contact your senator now to demand that the For the People Act be heard. The House passed HR1, 234 to 193 votes, and the bill is on the Senate Legislative calendar now.

President's Message

Why Do You Do It?

Last month my goal for this column was to thank you for your gifts to AAUW and to our branch. I hope that you felt appreciated. In the weeks between then and now I've thought about why you are so generous. Maybe it's in your soul, your DNA, to be giving. Perhaps it's part of your faith, of what you believe is a good thing to do. Maybe you find it a preferable way to spend your time. Watching hours of TV or searching Facebook bores you, so giving your time and energy to AAUW is a preferable choice. Then again, maybe you feel good inside when you see what your time and money has accomplished. If that's the case, let me tell you about the good that the money that we give does. You'll probably want to do more.

Recently, our AAUW Funds Committee met to choose our two scholarship winners from eleven applicants. Reading their stories and learning about their struggles to get an education helped me to once again realize that not everyone has had an easy path to get that degree. Of course, we want to help, when we learn about a woman's desire to become a better, more educated woman. What is even more impressive is to learn that these women also want to give back. They want to help others access all that a good education can provide.

This year's winners of our Returning Scholar awards, Claudia and Paulina, have different goals and amazing stories. Claudia is working on a Master's of Science in Biomedical and Informatics at the Graham School of the University of Chicago. Her journey was not traditional. She was brought up in a family that didn't encourage women to pursue an education. She was the first woman in her family to ever attend a 4-year university. Paulina, also seeking her education through a nontraditional journey, is working on a degree to become a registered nurse. In 2006, she came to the U.S. alone from Poland is search of a better life. Once again, her parents did not support more than a high school education for her. As she works toward her degree, she continues as a property manager-housekeeper. She believes that her choice to be a nurse will make a difference in somebody's life.

Since many of our gifts, especially our national dues, are given directly to AAUW, think about these statistics. Our AAUW research, programs and advocacy work were covered by 246 media outlets, including national publications such as Time, Money, U.S. News and World Report and The New York Times, and radio programs in local markets and on NPR's Marketplace. Collectively, we reached more than 356 million people! We must be doing work that is valued by our society. Women all over the country are benefitting from Smart Work, our lobbying efforts to pass laws that advance women's rights, and our LAF support of those who have been treated unfairly at school and in the workplace. Our dues and our gifts seem to be working very well!

As we toil carting, sorting and selling books this summer, think about the good that this effort affords. Our labor results in the money that provides all of these wonderful accomplishments!!! Just maybe this is why you (we) do it!


