
AAUW MONTHLY MEETING

I am glad we transitioned to meeting "in person" this past year. I thank all of our branch officers who have volunteered so many hours to help continue our very important mission. I am looking forward to attending our meeting on January 4th to discuss *Sisters in Arms.* I downloaded it from the Elmhurst Public Library, since I didn't find a "hard copy" available.

Looking over the past year, our branch had the most successful book sale ever, and as usual, we had fun doing it. Our loyal group of sorters worked 6 days a week, filled every table with books to sell, and along with a crew from York High School Football Team, made quick work of clean up and recycling. We were able to keep thousands of books out of landfills and grossed over \$20,000. We thank Carolyn Heiney and Jennifer Jordan for their hard work to organize this important fund raiser.

Under the leadership of Judy Ekblad, the Funds Committee made a proposal which membership approved for the disbursement of the profits: Using the additional funds from the Conference Account, the Funds Committee proposes that \$10,000 be used for local scholarships and \$10,000 be sent to the national AAUW organization. The committee recommends that the Elmhurst Area Branch offer three \$3,000 scholarships to returning students and one \$1,000 scholarship to a Dare-to-Dream Scholarship student. It is exciting to be able to offer these substantial scholarships.

Our donation of \$10,000 to the national organization would be divided as follows: \$5000 to the Greatest Needs Fund; \$2,500 to the Education and Training Fund; \$2,500 to the National Conference for College Women Student Leaders Scholarships (Note: The acronym is pronounced: "Nicwhistle").
