## The Fly Girls of WWII

Over 1100 women served their country as Women Airforce Pilots (WASP) in World War II, flying every military aircraft from the PT-17 Stearman to the B-17 Flying Fortress. The focus of this presentation is on the women, led by famed Speed Queen Jackie Cochran, who were the first American women to fly military aircraft for the Army and Navy in WWII. Rebecca Sutera Tulloch, a certified FAA pilot, tells the story of these women and the role they played in the war effort.

# "Raising Awareness of Diversity and Inclusion"

Deanie Brown, presenter, is an attorney and the Chief Diversity and Inclusion Officer for the Illinois Supreme Court in Springfield. She has been an associate chancellor, chief of staff, and director of HR and internal relations at universities in Illinois, California, and New Orleans, and serves on several boards supporting equity, education, the community, and the arts.

In addition to speaking about raising awareness, Deanie will explore the concept of "allyship": how to become an ally and developing the skills for responding to a situation that requires a "Stand Up, Speak Out" response. Deanie will also highlight the harms that persist when we don't prioritize diversity, equity, inclusion, and opportunity.

I am so delighted that Deanie Brown will be speaking to us virtually about Diversity Awareness on Thursday, April 20, at 7 pm. I very much hope that you will plan to attend. (See Zoom instructions on page 3.)

As you know Deanie is an attorney (that's almost as good as being a doctor!). But Deanie is also selfless in giving of her time, is warm and kind, and is passionately committed to helping us learn about diversity, equity and inclusion concepts. For all this, I admire her greatly.

The first time I attended a program given by Deanie, she asked for questions and discussion at the end. Being the sort of person who's always been in danger of dislocating my shoulder in my efforts to get the teacher to call on me, I told her about an experience I'd had with my hairdresser.

My mother's hairdresser had very kindly visited my mother in the hospital to do her hair. I was so grateful to her for making that extra effort that meant so much to my mother, I started going to her myself after my mom died.

But one day, my stylist did my hair while her family waited in the salon so that they could all go out together as soon as my appointment was done. Her brother-in-law and another man started talking about how African American men don't know how to shoot, elaborately miming incorrect shooting behavior. I was very uncomfortable, deeply offended and a little bit frightened, and I never went back.

I told Deanie this story and in response, she asked me if I had ever told my hairdresser how I felt. I had not; it had NEVER even occurred to me to tell my hairdresser how I felt about this episode. And, I think I would have found the prospect of telling my hairdresser how I really felt kind of frightening.

I have two master's degrees, but the truth is, I was totally unprepared to be an ally. I didn't know how to do it, and certainly didn't know how to respond in the moment. And yes, it happened in Elmhurst.

That's why I'm so thrilled that Deanie has agreed to add some extra remarks to her program about how to be an ally to the April 20th program.

Being an ally requires heart. But being an effective ally is much easier when you've learned to recognize the situations where you need to intervene, and you've acquired the skills that can help you respond. And that's why I'm so eager to have you join us for what I think really will be an important program on April 20th. Save the date.
