President's Message

Happy Spring! March not only brought us warmer weather and longer days but also "celebrated" two major observances important to AAUW - Women's History Month and sadly Equal Pay Day. I am summarizing the following information from National that you may not have had a chance to read, but I feel is very important.

On Equal Pay Day 2023—March 14th—we looked at the current state of the gender pay gap: Women working full-time, year-round are paid 84 cents, and all earners (including part-time and seasonal) are paid 77 cents on average for every dollar paid to men.

Pay equity will remain an AAUW priority until the pay gap is fully eliminated. We've long known that on average, pervasive pay inequities mean that women in the workforce take home less than men—and that women of color are often paid far less.

How you can help: In March, Congress took the first step and introduced the bipartisan Paycheck Fairness Act. When passed, the Paycheck Fairness Act will ensure all women have the tools they need to challenge discrimination in the workplace and all employers have the incentives they need to comply with the law. To make equality a reality, we need you to:

- · Contact your members of Congress
- · Write a Letter to the Editor
- · Engage your communities on social media

Why are we still talking about the gender pay gap? Because it has barely changed in decades, and these historic inequities were further exacerbated when the COVID-19 crisis hit. Women over the past three years, especially women of color and mothers, were pushed into part-time or seasonal work, or out of the workforce all together. As elected officials continue efforts to rebuild our nation in the wake of the dual public health and economic crises, they must do better. We cannot build back an economy that works for everyone without ensuring that all women can work with equality, safety, and dignity—starting with pay equity.

Speak out this Equal Pay Day and support the Paycheck Fairness Act now!

DEI STUDY GROUP REPORT

I'm so looking forward to April. Not just because of daffodils and warm weather, but because it's finally time for our "Raising Awareness of Equity and Inclusion," program with Deanie Brown, attorney and Diversity and Inclusion Officer for the Illinois Supreme Court in Springfield, on Thursday, April 20th, at 7 pm on Zoom.

Deanie is a member of the Springfield Branch of AAUW, a member of the Springfield Disability Commission, and the winner of the 2022 AAUW Agent of Change award. Not only that, but this very special program is being co-sponsored by the Elmhurst, Downers Grove, Naperville and Jane Addams (Statewide) AAUW Branches. And last, but far from least, Deanie is a charmball!

I've asked Deanie to discuss the concepts in the AAUW DEI Toolkit, and to place a special emphasis on "Creating Allyship," because I've recently come to realize that creating allyship is a much bigger and more complicated topic than I realized.

When I was at the U of I, I lived in a dorm and ran with a group of students from my floor. One day, they got into some kind of tangle with the floor's Resident Adviser, an African American, and I found out about it when they started trading racial epithets to describe her. I didn't know our R.A., but I had met her one day when I was in tears because of family problems. My R.A. insisted that I tell her what was wrong, even though I didn't want to, and really helped me to feel better.

When my R.A.'s boss called me and asked me if my friends were racist, I was really on the spot. I didn't want to betray my friends; but I also felt I owed my R.A. some loyalty because she had been kind to me. I was too much of a coward to rise to the occasion and said, "I don't know how you can see into people's hearts," which is pretty darn funny because I think I'd probably just had a big picture window into their hearts. I now realize that this was a missed opportunity to be an ally.

A member of AAUW Springfield, Deanie was honored as the 2022 AAUW Agent of Change at the AAUW Illinois State Conference.

In addition to speaking about raising awareness, Deanie will explore the concept of "allyship": how to become an ally and to develop the skills for responding to a situation that requires a "Stand Up, Speak Out" response.

Deanie will also highlight the harms that persist when we don't prioritize diversity, equity, inclusion, and opportunity.
