"Singing Bird and the Importance of Native American Women in Illinois"

In March our Elmhurst Area AAUW branch traditionally partners with the Elmhurst Public Library for a program to celebrate Women's History Month. This year's program on Wednesday, March 6, 2024, at 7PM features Kim Sigafus as Singing Bird. Dressed in native regalia, Kim Sigafus will delve into the day-to-day lives of Native American women to learn about courting, marriage and child-rearing practices, and how they affected the history of Illinois.

Kim is an internationally-published award-winning Ojibwa author and speaker. Her creative writing side includes 10 years of newspaper and photo-journalistic work. The genres she works in include Native American children's picture books, YA fiction, plays, non-fiction, and fiction writing. Kim travels frequently throughout the Midwest doing book signings and Native American programs.

Musical theater is a big part of her life. She's been a lyricist, singer, actor, and director for many years, and in her quiet time she makes dream catchers, and drums and sings.

Kim's been honored to have been chosen to be on the 2023-24 roster for the Illinois Humanities Road Scholars Speakers Bureau. She will be presenting her new program for them, Singing Bird and the Importance of Native American Women in Illinois History, the same program we will hear on March 6, at 7 PM.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Hello AAUW Members:

March will be Women's History Month. This is a time to look ahead and see where we can continue to have an impact on policies which impact gender equity in education and income security. If you can, get involved. Close the gender pay gap. Pass paid family leave. Stop sexual harassment. Together we can change federal, state and local policies to advance gender equality!

The National Website AAUW.org has a Take Action section where you can "Explore the Issues", "Get Empowered" and "Take Action". I hope many of you will get involved by becoming a "Two-Minute Activist", if you already aren't one. AAUW provides all the tools we need to easily send messages to our members of Congress, and contact our state legislators about pressing issues. It only takes two minutes.

Sixty-four new Illinois laws went into effect on January 1, 2024. A particularly important new piece of Illinois election law is SB2123 which should increase voter turnout. The new law allows an individual to pre-register to vote on or after they turn 16, but they will not receive a ballot until they reach voting age. This new law also extends the sunset date for the Access to Voting for Persons with Disabilities Advisory Task Force and establishes two new task forces exploring ranked choice voting and the security of remote vote by mail.

"Creating Allyship"

Everyone owns and contributes to workplace culture (or school, or volunteer-work culture). But what does that mean when someone says or does something that could leave others feeling disrespected or marginalized? Who responds, and how? Allies help create a strong, inclusive culture through daily actions and practices that address problematic behavior, even when they are not the target of such behavior themselves. It's an important component in creating an inclusive environment.

Join us for "Creating Allyship," a program co-sponsored by the Elmhurst Branch of the American Association of University Women, ComeUnity, and the Elmhurst Park District, on Tuesday, March 12, at 7 pm. Jim Percic of ComeUnity will lead the program, which will feature a short film, "Creating Allyship," in which author and activist Dr. Joy DeGruy shares an example of "allyship." In this example, Dr. DeGruy's lighter-skinned recognized and confronted discriminatory behavior toward Dr. DeGruy as an ally. Discussion in small groups will follow.
