

We are busy collecting and sorting books at Sandburg for our Annual Used Book Sale, beginning on July 11, and ending on July 14. Every day, we have had a great turnout of volunteers to help us set up and organize the sale.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Elmhurst AAUW Members:

I hope you are having a great summer! I've seen many of you at the Book Sale sort. I'm going to check to see if I have a few more books to donate today and look forward to the sale in less than two weeks.

I attended a very successful Illinois State Convention in April at Elgin Community College with over 100 attendees for the AAUW-IL 100th Anniversary -Celebrating 100 Years of Empowering Women. In May we had a wonderful celebration of our own branch's 85th Anniversary at the River Forest Country Club. Many thanks to our 85th Anniversary celebration committee for all the work they put into this event.. Carolyn Heiney, Genie Urick, Suzanne Stock, Pat O'Dwyer and Sally Schuster as well as The Funds Committee ..Jo Mulvihill, Jennifer Jordan, Carolyn Heiney and Judy Eckblad.

We were thrilled that we had such a well deserved scholarship winner - Kathryn Wheeler. Donna Jean Simon, the outgoing AAUW IL President gave a very informative speech about our history of contributing to Elmhurst. After the event our branch received a framed "Proclamation" signed by Mayor Scott Levin from The City of Elmhurst which also reiterated many of our branches successes over the 85 years. It declared that May 23, 2024 to be "AMERICAN ASSOCIATION OF UNIVERSITY WOMEN - ELMHURST AREA BRANCH DAY."

Thank you to those who recently voted on the proposed Bylaws change. We are sorry that although Illinois strongly supported the Bylaws proposal with a 78% affirmative vote and over 50% voter participation, the nation-wide vote garnered 65.1% affirmative, not reaching the 2/3 vote threshold. We are sad that we are not going to reach the 61% of women without college degrees who might well support our mission.

I want to share some statistics I learned at a recent virtual Illinois President's meeting:

-AAUW has over 52,000 members, 700 branches, 450 college/university members.

-Lobby Corps resumed visits to Capitol Hill and visited 150+ legislative offices. -2-Minute Activists sent 47,000 messages to elected officials.

-\$6.1 million in fellowships and grants was awarded to 277 women.
