AAUW 205-2026 Budgets

At the board meeting on 2/26/25, the board of directors approved the budgets for the upcoming fiscal year, as recommended by the Finance Committee.

Our branch fiscal year begins on July 1. We have 2 separate budgets: Fundraiser fund and General fund. You'll find links to those detailed budgets in the PDF files below.

Fundraiser Fund:

This budget covers our summer used book sale and any other fundraising activities during the year.

This budget always balances to zero. Per branch policy, all fundraising proceeds (after expenses are paid) are split 50% to AAUW National, and 50% retained for local scholarships.

General Fund:

This budget covers all regular, non-fundraising income and expenses for our branch.

For the upcoming year, we are budgeting to spend \$1,102 more than we'll receive in income. The board is comfortable with this budget because typically we don't spend all the money budgeted for expenses and we currently have over \$10,000 in our General Fund that will provide a cushion if needed.

Our job will be to create snack bags not just for those traveling via Greyhound but also for local immigrant children whose parents who cannot easily able to obtain food due to the current environment.

Pat Motto has asked us to add more fruit and healthy foods to the bags. Not just applesauce, but fruit cups too if possible. And perhaps not many cookies and sweets, but granola bars and and Nature's Bakery Fig Bars for example.

"I will try to have our Brownies make some positive, encouraging artwork (with words of support, primarily in Spanish) to include in the bags during our 3/22 meeting, that I can then color copy and have ready for the snack bags. "

Amy has created this online list to keep everyone in the know of what is being brought.

"As we discussed, we're aiming for relatively healthy, non-perishable items. I told the families that if they don't know how many items they can donate, to just pick the type(s) and they can fill in the exact quantity later. This will help us gauge how many bags we have to assemble. As anyone from last year will remember, the girls were incredibly efficient at this--especially since your AAUW ladies set up the assembly line so well around the table! I think our Scouts got to work before I could even tell them what to do!"
